EXPORT OF ARMS, EXPLOSIVES, AND
AIRCRAFT TO SPAIN.

With effect from the 19th August 1936, the Board of Trade have withdrawn the application to Spain, Spanish Possessions, and the Spanish Zone of Morocco of the three Open General Export Licences, Nos. G.L. 110, 111, and 112, which were issued on 1st June 1931, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931.
