HYDROX AND CARDOX CARTRIDGES.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that under Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, the Board of Trade have made an Order entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines (Hydrox and Cardox) Order, 1936," consolidating and amending the Explosives in Coal Mines (Hydrox) Order, 1935, and the Explosives in Coal Mines (Cardox) Order, 1934, which permit and regulate the use of Hydrox and Cardox cartridges in mines under the Act.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Officer of Customs and Excise (Male) under the Board of Customs and Excise will be held, commencing on the 12th January 1937, under the Regulations dated the 12th September 1930 and published in the London Gazette of the same date and in the Edinburgh Gazette of 16th September 1930; the first part of the Examination will be held in Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Plymouth, and Portsmouth.

Not fewer than 50 candidates will be appointed on the result of this examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

No person will be admitted to examination

from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 12th November 1936, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Male Map Constructor Apprentice (Non-established) in the Mapping Section of the Department of Military Operations and Intelligence of the War Office will be held, commencing on the 26th January 1937, under the Regulations dated the 17th December 1935 and published in the London Gazette of the same date and in the Edinburgh Gazette of 20th December 1935.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

Not fewer than two vacancies will be filled on the result of this examination, if so many candidates should be found to be duly qualified.
