TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, Clause 1 of the regulations respecting competitive examinations for the situations of Shorthand-Typist and Clerk-Shorthand-Typist (Female) in Departments of the Civil Service, which were published in the London Gazette of the 31st July 1936 and in the Edinburgh Gazette of the 4th August 1936, has been amended to read as follows:—

Candidates appointed by the Civil Service Commissioners as Typists in the Trinity House, the Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and the Metropolitan Police Office, on the result of a general competition for situations as Typist in the Civil Service, will be regarded as Established Typists for the purpose of this Clause although not serving under the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
