

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Department of Agriculture for Scotland hereby give notice that in exercise of their powers under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, they have made, on 16th February 1937, an Order entitled The Sale of Diseased Plants (Scotland) (Amendment) Order of 1937. The Order, which is immediately operative, prescribes that in Article 1 of the Sale of Diseased Plants (Scotland) Order of 1936 there shall be substituted for the words "Inspector of the Department of Agriculture for Scotland" the words "Inspector of the Department of Agriculture for Scotland or of the Local Authority."
