Peeresses who wish to receive an invitation on the occasion of the Opening of Parliament by His Majesty the KING on Tuesday, October the 26th, should send a written application to this Office before October the 10th.

Owing to the large number of Peeresses who applied for invitations in 1935 and 1936 it has been found necessary to limit the number of invitations issued to 130, in order that the Peers who attend may use their right to occupy seats. Should the applications from Peeresses exceed this number a ballot will be held and invitations to those who are successful will be issued on, or before, October the 17th.

Peers' Eldest Sons desiring seats in the Peers' Eldest Sons' Box are requested to make a written application to this Office.

All applications for tickets for the Royal Gallery must be made by *letter* and will bear the name of the lady or gentleman for whom they are required.

Parking facilities will be provided for the State Opening. All those who desire to take advantage of this arrangement are requested to make a separate application to this Office for a Car Ticket to enable them to park their cars at the respective places allocated to them.

Holders of tickets will be admitted at the respective entrances shown thereon.

The doors will be opened at 10.30 a.m. and closed at 11.30 a.m. o'clock.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 8th October 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 11th October 1937 to Saturday the 16th October 1937 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given
