The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 13th instant, to appoint Arthur Hunter Denholm Gillies, Esquire, Advocate, presently Sheriff-Substitute of Ross, Cromarty and Sutherland, at Dingwall and Tain, to be Sheriff-Substitute of Lanarkshire, at Airdrie, with effect as from the 25th instant, in the room of David Alexander Guild, Esquire, Advocate, who has been transferred to Glasgow.

The Secretary of State has been pleased to direct that James Rattray Gibb, Esquire, Advocate, presently Sheriff-Substitute of Ross, Cromarty and Sutherland, at Dornoch, shall perform also the duties of Sheriff-Substitute at Dingwall and Tain as from the 25th instant.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 22nd October 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued

under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 25th October 1937 to Saturday the 30th October 1937 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
