## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 20th May 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 23rd May 1938 to Saturday the 28th May 1938 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made

to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

BURGH OF PAISLEY PLANNING  
SCHEME.

NOTICE is hereby given that—

(1) On the 11th day of May 1938 the Department of Health for Scotland notified their approval of the Resolution of the Town Council of Paisley, dated the 31st day of January 1938, deciding to prepare the above Planning Scheme with reference to an area comprising the Burgh of Paisley.

(3) Any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within the Burgh of Paisley and any local association representing business or industry may, by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Town Council to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order (Scotland), 1933\* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the Scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order, and in addition the Town Council are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the Scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited along with the aforesaid Map.

The Town Council intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme, and any suggestions as to proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Town Clerk.
