4. *Fruit and Vegetable Preserving Hours of Women and Young Persons Regulations*, prescribing conditions subject to which the occupier of a factory may avail himself of the special exception in section 94 of the Act.

REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

SANITARY WARE OF POTTERY.

With reference to the Notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh, and Belfast Gazettes of 8th October 1937, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of an application for the making of an Order in Council amending Part I. of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order, 1928, so as to provide that the indication of origin required by that Order to be applied to imported sanitary ware of pottery shall be applied in a prescribed position and in letters of a minimum size, the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Sub-Section (7) of Section 2, that a report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid description of goods.

Part I. of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order, 1928, renders it unlawful to import into the United Kingdom, or, if imported, to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom, *inter alia*, any goods of the above description, unless they bear an indication of origin stamped, printed, embossed, or impressed on each article indelibly.
