### RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893. ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS, 1930-34.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiry of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Road Traffic Acts, 1930-34, to make regulations relating to the duration of Road Service Licences.
