The following address having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Lord Hawkesbury, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been by his Lordship presented to the King; which address his Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

We, the Noblemen, Gentlemen, Freeholders, Justices of the Peace, and Commissioners of Supply of the County of Renfrew, beg leave to approach your Majesty with the deepest sentiments of veneration, duty, and attachment to your person, family, and government.

Under the arduous and novel circumstances in which your dominions are placed, by a confederacy equally unprecedented in its extent, as extravagant and unprincipled in its nature, formed by the intrigues, and urged on by the malice of an implacable enemy, we venerate in your Majesty the dignified and magnanimous assertor of the cause of your people. Convinced that the honour, independence, and security of your subjects are the objects at all times nearest to your heart, and inseparable from your conduct, whether in the exercise of your royal prerogative, these important ends are to be effected by war, or by a peace consistent with them.

That your Majesty may be long preserved to your people, their august and revered father and friend, and an illustrious example to Sovereigns; that your magnanimous efforts in the cause of Europe, in the great cause of mankind, may, under the blessing of Divine Providence, be crowned with ultimate success, is the fervent prayer of your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful servants, the Noblemen, Gentlemen, Freehold-

ers, Justices of the Peace, and Commissioners of Supply of the County of Renfrew.
