SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE-DIPPING AREAS.

The following Area is a "Movement Area" for the purposes of Part II. of the Sheep Scab Order of 1938:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the Island of Berneray, in the parish of Harris, and all the grazing islands attached thereto and the Island of Barra and the adjacent islets attached to the holdings of Barra), in the county of Inverness.

The following Area is a "Movement Area" and a "Double-Dipping Area" for the purposes of Parts II. and III. respectively of the Sheep Scab Order of 1938:—

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

The movement of sheep out of the following area is regulated by the North Uist (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934:—

An area in the county of Inverness comprising the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the Island of Berneray, in the parish of Harris, and all the grazing islands attached thereto.
