(3) any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in any of these areas and any association representing owners of property within the County of Fife and any local association representing business or industry may, by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the County Council to register without charge his or their name and

address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme. Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order (Scotland), 1933,* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the Scheme is

permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the County Council are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the Scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited along with the aforesaid maps.
