## NATIONAL GALLERIES OF SCOTLAND (APPLICATION OF TRANSFERRED PROPERTY) ORDER, 1939.

In virtue of the powers conferred on me by Sub-section two of Section six of the National Galleries of Scotland Act, 1906 (6 Edw. 7, ch. 50), I, the Right Honourable John Colville, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby prescribe with regard to the funds which are at present held in terms of the said Sub-section by the Board of Trustees established by the said Act, but are so far unallocated in respect that purposes have not been prescribed for the application thereof, that a portion of the general fund of the Board shall be applied by the Board for the following purpose:—

A sum not exceeding £30 shall be applied out of the said general fund for the purpose of publicity in connection with the Jubilee of the Scottish National Portrait Gallery.

This Order may be cited as the National Galleries of Scotland (Application of Transferred Property) Order, 1939.
