WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

INDUSTRIAL DISEASES.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 12th February 1940 he made an Order under sub-section (3) of Section 43 of the above Act. The effect of the Order, which will come into force on the 1st April 1940, is to add to the Schedule of Industrial Diseases under the Act, "Infection by *Leptospira icterohæmorrhagæ*."

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 26th February 1939 he made Regulations in pursuance of sub-section (2) of Section 129 of the Factories Act, 1937, *revoking* the Order, dated February 4th, 1902, made under Section 7 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, which prescribes a standard of ventilation for certain humid textile factories other than cotton cloth factories.
