

THE BUCKHAVEN AND LEVEN GAS (CHARGES) ORDER, 1929, DATED JUNE 14, 1929, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 6 OF THE GAS UNDERTAKINGS ACT, 1929 (19 & 20 GEO. 5, c. 24).

IN pursuance of the above Order, the Buckhaven and Leven Gas Commissioners hereby give notice that as from the fifteenth day of November nineteen hundred and forty they will supply gas of a Calorific Value of 425 B.Th.U. gross per cubic foot.
