TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 29th August 1941, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1941, to the amount of £75,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 1st September 1941 to Saturday the 6th September 1941 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

WAR DAMAGE ACT, 1941.

SECTION 7.

The War Damage Commission hereby give notice that they have, for the purpose of giving effect to directions given by the Treasury under sub-section (1) of Section 7 of the War Damage Act, 1941, and under the power conferred upon them by sub-section (2) of the said Section, specified the following class of works for making good war damage:—

Works costing more than £1000 or six times the gross annual value (if any) of the hereditament, whichever is the less, to be executed for making good the war damage sustained by any single hereditament situated within the Burgh of Clydebank.

The War Damage Commission also give notice that they, under the power conferred upon them by the aforementioned sub-section, impose on any person who proposes to execute for making good war damage any works (other than temporary works) of the above specified class, an obligation to inform the War Damage Commission of the proposal, and thereafter to furnish to them such particulars of the proposed works as they may require in any particular case.

For the purpose of this Notice lands and heritages separately entered in the Valuation Roll shall be deemed to be a single hereditament, except that in the case of a tenement or other building, parts of which are separately entered in the Valuation Roll, the tenement or building shall be deemed to be a single hereditament and in the case of any particular lands or heritages not entered in the Valuation Roll the particular lands and heritages shall be deemed to be a single hereditament.
