

MEMORANDUM.

Horse Guards, September 3, 1808.

His Majesty has been pleased to grant to the 24th regiment of Light Dragoons, his most gracious permission to assume, in addition to any other badges or devices to which it may be entitled, and to bear on its colours and on its appointments the Elephant, with the word " Hindoostan" inscribed around it, in commemoration of the distinguished valour displayed by this corps in the battles fought at Alli-Ghur on the 4th September 1803, and at Delhi on the 9th of the same month, and as a lasting testimony of the exemplary conduct of this corps during the period it has served in India.
