DEFENCE (FINANCE) REGULATIONS, 1939.

TREASURY DIRECTION UNDER REGULATION 3C (3A).

The Treasury, in pursuance of Their powers under paragraphs (3A) of Regulation 3c of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, hereby direct that in any case where all the personal representatives of a deceased person are resident in the sterling area for the purposes of the said Regulation and of any order providing for exemptions from any of the provisions thereof they shall be treated for the purposes aforesaid as being resident in the sterling area (and not elsewhere) so far as relates to any transactions in which they are concerned solely in their capacity as such personal representatives, notwithstanding that the deceased person may have been resident outside the sterling area for the purposes aforesaid at the time of his death.

ALLIED POWERS (MARITIME COURTS) ACT, 1941.

In pursuance of section 1 (4) of the Allied Powers (Maritime Courts) Act, 1941, the Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, at the request of the Government of Belgium, that that Government has established Maritime Courts in the United Kingdom for the purpose of the Act, namely, a Maritime Court of Appeal and a Maritime Court of First Instance.
