TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed b. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be ob ained from the Chief Cash er's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
