RAILWAY AND CANAL COMMISSION.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that, after the expiration of at least 40 days from the date hereof, the Railway and Canal Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, and of Sections 9 and 14 of the Railways (Valuations for Rating) Act, 1930, and of those sections as applied with adaptations and modifications by the Scheme made and approved by the Minister of Health under Section 92 (3) of the London Passenger Transport Act, 1933, propose to make, with the approval of the Lord Chancellor and the Secretary of State, a special rule relating to all appeals and proceedings before the Railway and Canal Commissioners under the said Act of 1930 and to all appeals and proceedings under that Act as applied with adaptations and modifications by the said Scheme.

Copies of the above Draft Rules which may be cited as the Railway and Canal Commission Draft Rules, 1945, may be obtained from the Lord Chancellor's Office.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that subscriptions for 3 per cent. Savings Bonds, 1965-1975, under the Prospectuses dated the 5th August 1944, issued by the Bank of England, the Postmaster-General and the National Debt Commissioners and for 1½ per cent. Exchequer Bonds, 1950, under the Prospectus dated the 6th November 1944, issued by the Bank of England, will continue to be received until further notice provided that—

(1) 3 per cent. Savings Bonds, 1965-1975, and 1½ per cent. Exchequer Bonds, 1950, in respect of which interest accrues from a date later than the 14th February 1945, will in each case be designated Series "A" until the 15th August 1945, on which date they will be amalgamated with the relative Bonds already issued.

(2) The first interest payment on 3 per cent. Savings Bonds, 1965-1975, Series "A," and 1½ per cent. Exchequer Bonds, 1950, Series "A," will be due on the 15th August 1945.

COLONIAL STOCK ACTS, 1877-1934.

ADDITION TO LIST OF STOCKS UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE COLONIAL STOCK ACT, 1900 (63 AND 64 VIC., CAP. 62).

Pursuant to Section 2 of the Colonial Stock Act, 1900, the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury hereby give notice that the provisions of the Act have been complied with in respect of the under-mentioned stock registered or inscribed in the United Kingdom:—

New Zealand Government ¾ per cent. Stock, 1962-65.

The restrictions mentioned in Section 2, sub-section 1, of the Trustee Act, 1925, apply to the above stock. (See Colonial Stock Act, 1900, Section 2.)

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 16th February 1945, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1944, to the amount of £110,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 19th February 1945 to Saturday the 24th February 1945 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
