The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of June 1945 (N.13068 39), in the words following, viz. :—

Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas Order in Council dated the 13th December 1921, authorised monetary awards in the form of lump sum payments at certain prescribed periods, to Ordnance Artificers, voluntarily transferred from Engine Room Artificers, as compensation for the consequential loss of the allowances of 1s. a day in each case for the Engine Room Watchkeeping and Charge Certificates which they either held or might have been expected to gain in the normal course had they remained in their original Branch :

"And whereas provision was not made in the aforesaid Order in Council for any compensation to such Ordnance Artificers who, after having completed time for pension, have been retained or mobilised for further service in consequence of the present war :

"And whereas we consider that these ratings should receive further compensation for the loss of certificate allowances during the period of their war service :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the award to such ratings on their discharge or demobilisation of a lump sum payment representing the capitalised value of the certificate allowances with interest at 3 per cent. for the period of their service from the 3rd September 1939, or date of mobilisation, as the case may be, until the termination of hostilities or date of discharge, whichever is the earlier.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay,

pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas by clause 6 of the Schedule to Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of May 1925, it is provided that Dental Officers shall be eligible for allowances at the rates and under the conditions applicable to Medical Officers of corresponding rank, with the exception of Specialist and Flag allowances :

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the above provision concerning Specialist Allowance should be suspended, and that Dental Officers should be eligible for this allowance :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from 28th December 1944, and as a wartime measure only, payment of Specialist Allowance at the rate of 5s. a day and subject to the general conditions applicable to Medical Specialist Allowances, to Dental Officers while actually appointed to specialist posts in which they are required to act in a consultative capacity and undertake treatment of difficult cases of maxillo-facial injury and minor oral surgery.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of July 1945 (C.W.39360/45), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas we consider that during the present emergency permanent officers on the active lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines should not receive pay whilst standing for election to Parliament or, if elected, whilst precluded by their Parliamentary duties from returning to Naval service :

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the Regulations contained in the annexed schedule :

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" 1. An officer relieved of his Naval duties to enable him to act as a candidate or prospective candidate for Parliament will cease to be eligible for any full pay, half pay, allowances or Naval emoluments whatsoever from the date of ceasing Naval duty, subject to any extensions of pay to which he may be entitled in respect of passage, home, or foreign service leave, or such other special extensions of pay as may be approved by the Admiralty.

" 2. If an officer is elected, and decides to return forthwith to Naval service, pay will recommence from and including the date on which notification of his decision reaches the Admiralty. If on the other hand he decides that his parliamentary duties require him to remain unavailable for naval duty, pay will continue to be suspended. Should such an officer subsequently decide to return to Naval service, pay will be restored from and including the date on which notification of his decision reaches the Admiralty. If an officer is not elected, his pay will be restored as from the day following the declaration of the poll.

" 3. Periods during which full pay, half pay, and allowances are suspended under the foregoing provisions will not count as service for any time promotion, increment of pay, retired pay, or for any service gratuity or war gratuity.

" 4. The foregoing rules will be applied, with such modification as the Admiralty may think fit, to officers standing for election to the Legislature of a Dominion or Colony."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the above-mentioned Act, it is hereby notified that the Right Honourable Herbert Stanley Morrison, M.P., was appointed Lord President of the Council; that the Right Honourable Arthur Greenwood, C.H., M.P., was appointed Lord Privy Seal; and that they became Members of the Cabinet on the 28th July 1945.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 17th August 1945, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1945, to the amount of £130,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 20th August 1945 to Saturday the 25th August 1945 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
