ARMY ACT.

It is proposed to amend Rules of Procedure, 1926, made under Section 70 of the Army Act.

Copies of the amendment can be obtained in accordance with the Rules Publication Act, 1893, from the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, Whitehall, S.W.1.

Civil Service Commission, 14th August 1945.

The Civil Service Commissioners give notice that the following extensions of the closing date for application will be allowed in the case of certain classes of candidates applying to compete at an examination under Reconstruction Regulations for the situations named, viz:—

(1) Clerical Classes, (2) Shorthand Typist, Typist and Clerical Assistant, (3) Assistant Preventive Officer in the Customs and Excise Department.

Applications from intending candidates who do not satisfy the educational requirement but who contemplate sitting for a School Certificate or Matriculation examination will be considered up to 1st November 1945, provided the candidates have then obtained the required qualifications.

(4) Executive Class, (5) Officer of Customs and Excise.

Applications from intending candidates who do not satisfy the educational requirement but who contemplate sitting for a Higher Certificate or University Intermediate examination will be considered up to 1st January 1947 (or, in the case of Service candidates, 18 months after completion of their service or 31st December 1948, whichever is the earlier), provided the candidates have then obtained the required qualifications. Further extension beyond 31st December 1948 for service candidates may be considered in individual cases.
