## QUEEN'S PALACE, JANUARY 17, 1809.

This day Monsieur Brinckman, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, and also Admiral Apodaco, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Supreme Junta of Spain, in the name of his Catholic Majesty Ferdinand VII, had private audiences respectively of her Majesty; to which they were introduced by the Earl of Morton, Lord Chamberlain to her Majesty, and conducted by Sir Stephen Cottrell, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.
