## WHITEHALL, JANUARY 28, 1809.

The King has been pleased to grant the dignity of a Baron of the united kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto the Right Honourable James Earl of Hopetoun, and the heirs-male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style, and title of Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, in the county of Linlithgow, with remainder to the heirs-male lawfully begotten of his late father, John Earl of Hopetoun, deceased.
