2. This Order shall be recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Aberdeen.

3. This Order may be cited as the Burgh Register of Sasines (Inverurie) Discontinuance Order, 1946.

PURCHASE TAX.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1.
