## DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES (EXTENSION) ACT, 1944.

His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, acting in pursuance of Subsection I. (b) of Section 3 of the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Act, 1944 (7 & 8 Geo. 6, Ch. 44), hereby gives notice of the cancellation of the list published in the Edinburgh Gazette of July 16th, 1946, of Representatives of Governments of Foreign Sovereign Powers attending the Preparatory Commission of the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organisation who are entitled to diplomatic immunities, such cancellation taking effect from July 13th, 1946.
