TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 30th August 1946, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, the National Loans Act, 1939, and the Miscellaneous Financial Provisions Act, 1946, to the amount of £150,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd September 1946, to Saturday, the 7th September, 1946 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

PAPER BOX WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) the revocation of the Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1945 (S.R. & O., 1945, No. 922), and for the fixing of specified statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present in operation, and (2) for the revocation of Order B (23) dated 25th July 1939, which relates to holidays with pay and for the making of a Wages Regulation Order in substitution for the provisions at present in operation.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague, or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*) 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*) 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*) 1850; rabies 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*) 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*) 1928. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.

No case of Fowl Pest (*pestis avium*) has been confirmed in Great Britain since the 11th January 1937 the date as from which the disease was first notifiable. So far as is known, however, Fowl Pest has not existed in Great Britain since 1933.

Distribution Area.

In the County of Ross and-Cromarty :-

So much of the Parishes of Applecross, Lochcarron and Lochalsh on the Mainland as lies within an imaginary line commencing at the junction of the Fionn-amhainn with the River Carron thence proceeding in a straight line in a southerly direction to the junction of the Allt Gleann a' Choire Dhombhain with the River Ling thence proceeding in a straight line drawn due east and west to a point on the south-eastern shore of Loch Carron 1,300 yards or thereabouts east of Stromeferry Station of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway Company thence following along the shore
