**FACTORIES ACT, 1937.**

The Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that on 3rd February 1947 he made, under Section 90 of the Factories Act, 1937, Regulations entitled The Factories Act Holidays (Different Days for Different Sets) Regulations, 1947.
