TRIPARTITE COMMISSION FOR THE RESTITUTION OF MONETARY GOLD.

In the Edinburgh Gazette of 1st October 1946 the announcement was made of the establishment of the Tripartite Commission for the Restitution of Monetary Gold, and of the appointment of Sir Desmond Morton, K.C.B., C.M.G., M.C., as the United Kingdom Commissioner.

Colonel R. E. L. Wingate, C.I.E., C.B.E., has been appointed Alternate Commissioner for the United Kingdom, to act in the absence of Sir Desmond Morton for the purposes and with the powers specified in the official announcement of the establishment of the Tripartite Commission.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932. WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(JOHN SIMPSON.)

Whereas John Simpson, L.R.C.P. Edin., L.R.C.S. Edin., L.R.F.P.S. Glasg., whose registered address is 1 Carriagehill Drive, Paisley, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932:

And whereas the said John Simpson cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any drug or preparation to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, or any drug to which the Raw Opium, &c. Regulations, 1937, apply:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, &c., Regulations, 1937, I hereby withdraw from the said John Simpson the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon him to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, &c. Regulations, 1937, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said John Simpson to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937.

Return No. 4/1947—

The number of outbreaks of Fowl Pest confirmed during the period 16th to 28th February 1947, and 1st January to 28th February 1947, should read 1 and not 2 as stated.

Return No. 5/1947—

The number of outbreaks of Fowl Pest confirmed during the period 1st January to 15th March 1947, should read 2 and not 3 as stated.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated :—Cattle plague, or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*) 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*) 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*) 1850; rabies 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*) 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*) 1923. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.
