REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR ADMISSION TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE AND BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 17 years of age on 1st September 1947. But

(i.) Candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service before 1st September 1947.

(ii.) Candidates employed on the first day of the examination as Established Clerical Assistants in the Civil Service may be admitted to the examination if under the age of 19 on 1st September 1947.

(iii.) Candidates appointed as Established Typists in the Civil Service from an Open Competition, who were under 17 years of age on the governing date for age for that Competition, may be admitted to the examination, provided that they have continued to be employed in the Established Typing Grades of the Civil Service up to the first day of the examination, and that they are under the age of 19 on 1st September 1947.

BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

2. Sex.

Both boys and girls are eligible.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects who satisfy the following rule :—

Every candidate must be either

(a) a natural-born British subject :

(i.) having at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii.) of any other parentage, provided that he or she has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his or her appointment; or

(b) a naturalized British subject who has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his or her appointment; or

(c) a British subject who, although not fulfilling the requirements of sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) satisfies the Commissioners that he or she is so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his or her favour

4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. Examination.

The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows :—

Compulsory Subjects.

(1) English	200
(2) Arithmetic	100

Optional Subjects—

(3) Mathematics	200
(4) Science	200
(5) One of the following languages :— French, German, Spanish, Latin, Greek, Welsh	200
(6) A second language chosen from the list given under head (5)	200
(7) History	200
(8) Geography	200

Candidates may take three optional subjects. Note that not more than two languages may be chosen from the list given under head 5. But candidates who wish to be assigned to Branch B of the Foreign Service must take either French or German or Spanish and reach a satisfactory standard in it; They will also be required to establish, in an interview at the Foreign Office, that they are in other respects suitable for appointment to the Foreign Service.

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit on their aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not obtain such an aggregate as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post to which he or she is assigned will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but subject

to that condition the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

7. Fee.

A fee of 5s. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the application form, and is not returnable in any circumstances. But this fee will not be required from candidates admitted under proviso (iv.) to Regulation 1.

These Regulations apply to the examination of September 1947. For subsequent examinations the Regulations will be similar, except for the governing date for age in Regulation 1. For an examination held in the first six months of any year the governing date will be the 1st March in that year; for an examination held in the last six months of any year it will be the 1st September in that year.

But candidates admitted to the September 1947 examination under proviso (iv.) to Regulation 1 who would otherwise have been within the age limit for that examination will be admitted to the next subsequent examination.
