EMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES IN THE GRADES OF VETERINARY INSPECTOR, RE-SEARCH OFFICER, AND ASSISTANT VETERINARY INVESTIGATION TEMPORARY OFFICER UNDER THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations

2. In order to be eligible, a candidate must have been born on or after the 2nd August 1907 and have attained the age of 23 by the 1st January of the year in which he or she competes. 3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions :--

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i.) have at least one parent who is or was-at death a British subject; or

(ii.) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. (a) Candidates for appointment as Veterinary Inspector must have graduated as a Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons and have had at least one year's practical experience in some recognised branch of the veterinary profession after such graduation.

(b) Candidates for appointment as Research Officer or Assistant Veterinary Investigation Officer should normally be members of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons but in exceptional cases this qualification may be dispensed with in view of the special requirements of the Ministry of Agricul-ture and Fisheries and the special qualifications of a candidate. Preference will be given to those candidates who have had

post-graduate experience in laboratory research work or in some other recognised branch of the veterinary profession.
5. Candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their

health and character. The Commissioners reserve the right to give such preference to disabled persons or particular classes of disabled persons as may be necessary in order to give effect to any general policy regarding the employment of such persons which may be adopted by His Majesty's Government, provided that the disability is not of a nature to interfere with the discharge

of the duties of the post. 6. No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete under these Regulations before the completion of the course, unless he or she has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant. 7. Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given

by the Commissioners.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries and are accepted by the Civil Ser-vice Commissioners as possessing the best qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment the candidates who appear to them to be most suitable. The Selection Board may also recommend that a certain number of candidates shall be classed as reserve candidates and considered by the Commissioners for appointment in conjunction sidered by the Commissioners for appointment in conjunction with the results of a later Board. The decision of the Commissioners will be final. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that may be obtained from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on its estimation of the above evidence the Board will frame its recommenda-tions tions.

9. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education autority (e.g. the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Depart-ment, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.
