PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS (SCOTLAND), 1937.


The Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as showing that the meat to which it relates or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State and that all necessary precautions for the provention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat or meat products.

Where the Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

SCHEDULE.

A label having on it a design in the form set out below, except that the circular device in the centre of the label and the serial number are printed in orange colour, and that in place of the serial number G8980522 other serial numbers may be substituted:
