## WAGES COUNCIL ACT, 1945.

### BRUSH AND BROOM WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Brush and Broom Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) the revocation of Parts I. to VI. of the Schedule to the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1946 (Order M(59)), as amended by the Brush and Broom Wages Regulation Order, 1947 (Order M(61)), and for the substitution of the minimum remuneration specified in the Schedule within; and (2) for the revocation of Order M(52), dated 30th May 1939, which relates to holidays with pay, and for the making of a Wages Regulation Order for holidays and holiday remuneration in substitution for the provisions at present in operation.

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 12th September 1947. Any such representation should be signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and sent to the Secretary, Brush and Broom Wages Council (Great Britain), Queen Anne's Chambers, 28 Broadway, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.

NOTE.—The above statement is based on returns received from 108 prescribed towns in England and Wales in the week ended 6th September 1947. The prices represent the average for all sales at these towns, which include transactions between growers and merchants, and some transactions between merchants, during the week ended 30th August 1947.

The Minister, on 10th September 1947, made the Motor Vehicles (Authorisation of Special Types) (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1947.

Under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940, the Secretary of State has made an Order extending by a further three years the time limited respectively

(a) by Section 30 of the Dundee Corporation Order, 1939, as confirmed by the Dundee Corporation Order Confirmation Act, 1939, as extended by the Dundee Corporation Order, 1939 (Extension of Time) Order, 1942, and the Dundee Corporation (Extension of Time) Order, 1946, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of Part III., Water Works and Lands of the Order;

(b) by Section 45 of the Order as extended by the Dundee Corporation Order, 1939 (Extension of Time) Order, 1942, and the Dundee Corporation (Extension of Time) Order, 1946, for the compulsory purchase of lands, houses, and property for or in connection with the street works authorised by Part V. of the Order;

(c) by Section 50 of the Order as extended by the Dundee Corporation Order, 1939 (Extension of Time)
