The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :-

TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES FOR MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS (DEPARTMENTAL CLASS) IN THE MINISTRY OF SUPPLY.

Men and women may compete under these Regulations.

2. Every candidate must have been born on or after 2nd August 1911 and have attained the age of 21 on the 1st January of the year in which he or she competes.

3. No person is eligible for employment in the Ministry of Supply who is not a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self governing.

Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions.

No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Minister of Supply, and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions: conditions :-

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i.) have at least one parent who is or was at death a

British subject; or

(ii.) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their

appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Every candidate must have received a full and proper training as a mechanical and or electrical engineer and will be required to state on his application form the nature of any particular engineering experience gained in the course

any particular engineering experience gamed in the course of or after training.

Normally he or she must either have obtained or be eligible for corporate membership of one of the Institutions of Civil. Mechanical, or Electrical Engineers or Associate Fellowship of the Royal Aeronautical Society. For the purpose of these Regulations eligibility for Corporate Membership (or Associate Fellowship of the R.A.S.) will be considered to include the following requirements:—

(a) An engineering apprenticeship or pupilage including a minimum period of two years in the workshops of a reputable establishment, and

(b) (i.) an engineering degree of a British University, or (ii.) a Higher National Certificate in mechanical or electrical engineering, or (iii.) have passed examinations recognised by the above-named professional Institutions as granting exemp-
