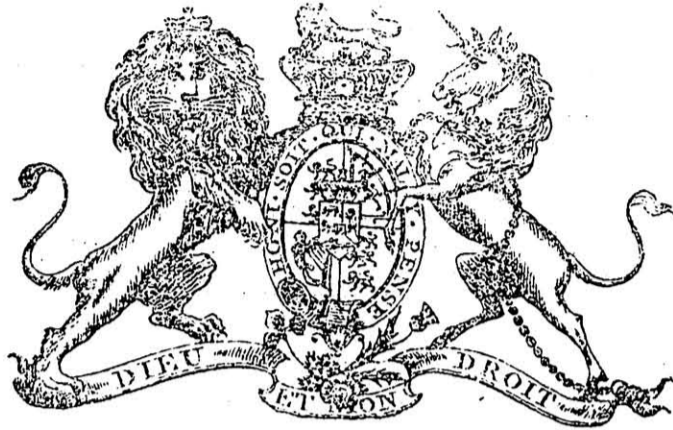

PRESENT,
The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint Hugh Elliot, Esq. to be Captain-General and Governor in Chief of his Majesty's Leeward Charibbee Islands in America, he this day took the oaths appointed to be taken by the Governors of his Majesty's plantations.

APRIL 15, 1809.
