CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in terms of Sub-section (1) of Section 101 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, the Corporation of the City of Aberdeen have made application to the Licensing Authority for Public Service Vehicles, Scottish Traffic Area for consent to the running of a service of motor omnibuses along the following route outwith the City, *videlicet*:—

"In the Parish of Old Machar and County of Aberdeen commencing at the City Boundary on the Bridge of Don and passing along the Ellon Road (A92) in a northerly direction; thence turning into and passing in a westerly direction along the North Donside arterial road; thence turning into and passing in a southerly direction along Scotstoun Road; thence turning into and passing in an easterly direction along Balgownie Road to its junction with the Ellon Road aforesaid; and thence returning to the City Boundary along the last-mentioned road."

The said service is intended to be operated from Castle Street northwards via King Street and the Bridge of Don in extension of an existing service from Nigg Post Office to Castle Street by way of Wellington Road, South Market Street, Market Street, and Union Street, all in Aberdeen.

And notice is hereby further given that objections to the giving of such consent may be made on the part of any other local authority, the council of any county, or any persons who are already providing transport facilities on or in the neighbourhood of any part of the said route by notice in writing to the aforesaid Licensing Authority, Scottish Traffic Area, Old Infirmary Buildings, Woolmanhill, Aberdeen, on or before the 13th day of March 1948.

NORTH OF SCOTLAND HYDRO-ELECTRIC BOARD.

CONSTRUCTIONAL SCHEME No. 16.

GLASCARNOCH-LUICHAFT-TORR ACHILTY PROJECT.

THE Electricity Commissioners have approved a Constructional Scheme prepared by the North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board in accordance with Section 5 of the Hydro-Electric Development (Scotland) Act, 1943, providing for the construction of Works, the situations of which are shown in Part I. of the Schedule hereto, and for the acquisition of the lands specified in Part II. of the said Schedule.

The Scheme has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for confirmation.
