DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 to 1932. WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(MARGARET PHILLIPA POSTHUMA.)

V eras Margaret Phillipa Posthuma, M.B., Ch.B., 1925, ist., whose Registered Address is The Old House, Horsley's Green, Stokenchurch, near High Wycombe, Bucks, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts, 1920 to 1932:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, &c., Regulations, 1937, I hereby withdraw from the said Margaret Philippa Posthuma the authorities conferred by the said Regulations upon her to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, &c., Regulations, 1937, apply:

And I hereby direct that it shall not be lawful for the said Margaret Philippa Posthuma to give prescriptions for the

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT. TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be:—

(a) to provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road from a point on Seamores Road at Dennyloanhead in the County of Stirling approximately 50 yards east of its junction with the Gretna-Stranraer-Glasgow-Stirling Trunk Road first in a south-westerly and then in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 70 yards to a point on the said Trunk Road approximately 15 yards south-west of the said junction;

(b) to provide for the stopping up entirely of the exist-

south-west of the said junction;
(b) to provide for the stopping up entirely of the existing junction between the said Trunk Road and Seamores Road when the new road has been completed;
(c) that the Stirling County Council will become the highway authority for the new road on the sixteenth day of May next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is opened for through traffic.

copies of the draft Order and the Plan showing the line of the new road may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of three months from 29th May 1948 at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, or at the offices of the Stirling County Council, Viewforth, Stirling, or at the office of the Burgh Engineer, Denny and Dunipace Town Council, Town House, Denny, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, 21 Castle Terrace, Edinburgh, 1.

Any person may within the said period of three months from 29th May 1948 object to the making of the Order by notice to the Minister addressed to Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.
