## MINISTERS OF THE CROWN ACT, 1937.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the above-mentioned Act, it is hereby notified that the Right Honourable Hugh Dalton, M.P., was appointed Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster and became a member of the Cabinet on the 2nd June 1948.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 11th June 1948, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 14th June 1948 to Saturday the 19th June 1948 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## FACTORIES ACT, 1937.

The Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that, on 31st May 1948, he made, under Sections 17, 46, and 60 of the Factories Act, 1937, regulations entitled The Building (Safety, Health and Welfare) Regulations, 1948. The Regulations supersede the Building Regulations, 1926 to 1931, which they revoke.

The making of the Regulations follows the Public Inquiry with respect to the draft which was held on 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, and 9th June, and 8th December 1947, by George Gordon Honeyman, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, the Commissioner appointed by the Minister in pursuance of the Second Schedule to the Act.

## WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

### HAT, CAP, AND MILLINERY WAGES COUNCIL (SCOTLAND).

The Hat, Cap, and Millinery Wages Council (Scotland) gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for the revocation of the Hat, Cap, and Millinery Wages Council (Scotland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946 (Order H.M.S.(30)), and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present in operation.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 8th June 1948.
