

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 13th August 1948, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 16th August 1948 to Saturday the 21st August 1948 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for the revocation of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1947 (Order H.L.(32)), and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the minimum rates of wages at present in operation; and (2) for the amendment of Order H.L.(16), dated 29th June 1939, which relates to holidays with pay.

tion to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals sent to it within fourteen days from 10th August 1948. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.

BOARD OF TRADE ANNOUNCEMENT.
SAFEGUARDING OF KEY INDUSTRIES.

The attention of traders is drawn to the Safeguarding of Industries (List of Dutiable Goods) Order, 1948 (S.I. No. 1826), published by the Board of Trade, which will take effect on the 20th August 1948. Copies may be obtained from H.M. Stationery Office, price 2d. net.

The Order introduces an additional list of articles liable to duty under Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, being articles falling within the scheduled heading relating to synthetic organic and other fine chemicals.

Amendments to lists H, H(ii.), H(iii.), and H(v.) are also made by this Order. The effect of these amendments is to remove redundant or obsolete items, to make all grades of carbon bisulphide and potassium permanganate liable to Key Industry Duty, to sub-divide two items for statistical purposes and to introduce the modern spelling of certain chemical descriptions.

This Order should read in conjunction with the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) (No. 7) Order, 1948 (S.I. No. 1811) and the Safeguarding of Industries (Reduction of Rates) Order, 1948 (S.I. No. 1815), notice of which is given on page 357 of this issue. The latter Order reduces the Key Industry Duty rate chargeable on four of the items in the new additional list, in accordance with the tariff commitments entered into in the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, 1947. The items concerned and the rates at which they will be chargeable are as follows:—

Acid citric (made by fermentation process) ...	10%
Caffeine and salts thereof	25%
Emetine and salts thereof	20%
Theobromine and salts thereof	25%
