THE BURIAL GROUNDS (SCOTLAND) (PARISH OF BALQUHIDDER, BALQUHIDDER CHURCHYARD) ORDER, 1948, made 8th October 1948.

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Scotland has, in WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Scotland has, in pursuance of the powers competent to him under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor dated 4th March 1948, pronounced by the Sheriff-Substitute of Perth and Angus at Dunblane, finding that the Burial Ground known as Balquhidder Churchyard in the Parish of Balquhidder Churchyard in the Parish of Balquhidder and County of Perth. County of Perth, is in a condition which is dangerous to health:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Burial Ground in terms of Section 5 of the aforesaid Act except for the reservation of the right of burial in the cases hereinafter

specified:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 5th day of August 1948 Notice of such Representation was given and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 20th day of September 1948, and that the said Order, or Notice thereof, should be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of the said Order, or Notice thereof, should be fixed on the doors of the church of or on some other conspicuous places within the Parish of Balquhidder one month before the said day of September 1948:

And whereas Notice of the said Representation and of the time when it pleased His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council has been duly published in the Edinburgh Gazette and fixed in manner required by the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows, viz.:—

1. That burials be forthwith discontinual in the said or the said or

1. That burials be forthwith discontinued in terms of Section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, in the Burial Ground known as Balquhidder Churchyard in the Parish of Balquhidder and County of Perth except for the reservation of the right of burial in the said Burial Ground

(1) Spouses of persons who are already buried in the said Burial Ground;
(2) Parents who have a child or children already buried

(2) Farents who have a child or children already buried in the said Burial Ground;
(3) Unmarried persons whose parent or parents are already buried in the said Burial Ground;
(4) Unmarried persons resident in the Parish whose brother or sister, is already buried in the said Burial Ground; Ground:

(5) Persons whom the County Council of the County of Perth may specially authorise to be buried in the said Burial Ground; and
(6) Cremated human remains.

(b) Cremated human remains.

Provided the exercise of the right of burial be not injurious to health or offensive or contrary to decency, that Notice be given to the District Sanitary Inspector not later than the day preceding that on which a grave is to be opened, and that no burial except the burial of cremated human remains shall be made unless the coffin can be laid at a depth of four feet from the surface of the ground to the upper surface of the coffin and that without interference with the remains of a previous burial.
