The London Gazette, of this date, contains dispatches from Rear-Admiral the Honourable Sir ALEXANDER COCHRANE, K. B., Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels at the Leeward Islands, announcing the capture of Le D'Hautpout French ship, of 74 guns, of the largest class.

PRESENT,

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by an order in Council, bearing date the 26th April 1809, his Majesty was pleased to direct, that the blockade imposed by that order should extend to all ports and places as far north as the river Ems inclusively; his Majesty, more distinctly to ascertain the places to be taken as included within the limits of the said blockade, is pleased, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said blockade shall be construed to extend so as to comprehend the Eastern as well as the Western Ems; and to prevent all vessels from sailing into or out of that river by any channel to the westward of the Isle of Juyst: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
