The Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises the Official Certificate, of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as showing (a) that the meat to which it relates was derived from animals inspected ante- and post-mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State, and (b) that all necessary precautions for prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat.

The Certificate being in the form of a label, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the ackage containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official

Certificate.
