The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1933, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz. :—

The Silk Duties (Drawback) (No. 1) Order, 1951, continuing for a further year, ending on the 30th September 1952, the Customs drawback payable on the exportation or shipment as stores of artificial silk tissue of the kind specified in the Schedule to the Order and of made-up articles manufactured from such tissue. The rate of drawback is increased from 1s. 6d. to 1s. 9d. the lb.

The Schedule to the Order applies to artificial silk tissue produced in the United Kingdom and proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be made from imported yarn, being of a weight not less than $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. per square yard and consisting in the warp solely of artificial silk multiple yarn and in the weft of not more than 6 threads per inch.

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 24) Order, 1951, which approves a new scheme for the allowance of drawback of Customs duty paid on square-sawn wood and timber, and veneers used in the manufacture of certain sewing machine woodwork and provides for drawback on carrying cases.

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 25) Order, 1951, which provides for the allowance of drawback of Customs duty paid on certain kinds of metal ornaments suitable for incorporation as decoration in clock cases, ink-stands, and similar articles used for domestic or office purposes.

1. There will be two methods of entry: Method I and Method II. Regulation 2 relates to Method I, and Regulations 3 and 4 to Method II; the remaining Regulations relate to both methods. No candidate may compete more than twice in all under Normal and Reconstruction Regulations;
