THE LYING IN STATE

On Monday, February 11th, Guards of Honour of the Royal Navy, the Army, and the Royal Air Force were mounted at King's Cross Station and Westminster Hall.

On the arrival of the train at 2.45 the Royal Coffin was removed by an Officer and ten men of the King's Company Grenadier Guards and placed upon a Gun Carriage drawn by the King's Troop, Royal Horse Artillery.

The Imperial State Crown was placed upon the Coffin, which was covered by the Royal Standard.

The Gun Carriage, flanked by the Bearer Party of the Grenadier Guards, was preceded by Mounted Police.

walked immediately behind the Royal Coffin, followed by certain Members of His late Majesty's Household.
