

The King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chester to elect a Bishop of that see, the same being void by the translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Henry William, late Bishop thereof, to the see of Bangor; and his Majesty has also been pleased, by his royal sign manual, to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Reverend Bowyer Edward Sparke, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them elected Bishop of the said see of Chester.

The King has also been pleased to recommend to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St Paul, London, the Honourable and Reverend Gerald Valerian Wellesley, Clerk, Master of Arts, to be by them elected into the place of Canon Residentiary of the said Cathedral Church, the same being vacant by the translation of the Right Reverend Father in God, Henry William, late Bishop of Chester, to the see of Bangor.

The King has also been pleased to grant to the Reverend William Harry Edward Bentinck, Clerk, Master of Arts, the place and dignity of a Prebendery of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter Westminster, void by the refignation of the Honourable and Reverend Genard Valerian Wellesley.
