

Inverness Trunk Road to be superseded by a new road will cease to be a trunk road on the sixteenth day of May next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Kincardine County Council (who will thereafter become the highway authority responsible for those lengths) that the relative new road is opened for through traffic.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as so amended, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the twenty-sixth day of June 1953, apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
