This day the Right Honourable John Lord Sheffield, and the Right Honourable Henry Wellesley, were, by his Majesty's command, sworn of his Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint Henry Pelham, Duke of Newcastle, to be Lord Lieutenant of the county of Nottingham, his Grace this day took the oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the oaths of allegiance and supremacy.
