The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of April 1955 (N.P. 1769/55), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 27th day of April, 1948, sanction was given to the payment of Submarine Pay at the rate of 4s. a day to Officers of the rank or relative rank of Lieutenant-Commander and below:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th day of September, 1949, sanction was given to the payment of Submarine Pay at the rate of 3s. 6d. a day to Leading ratings and above, and at the rate of 2s. 6d. a day to Able ratings and below:

"And whereas we consider that these allowances should be increased:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the revised rates of Submarine Pay as set out in the Schedule annexed hereto, with effect from 1st November 1953:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

"SCHEDULE. "Officers. Daily Rate. Midshipman 4s. Acting Sub-Lieutenant ... Sub-Lieutenant Commissioned Officer and Senior Commissioned Officer on the Branch List Lieutenant Lieutenant-Commander

REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITMENT FROM ESTABLISHED CLERICAL OFFICERS FOR THE EXECUTIVE CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 28 years of age on 1st August 1955.

Provided that the Commissioners may, at their discretion, waive the maximum age limit in favour of a candidate who although eligible, was prevented from attending an earlier Limited Competition for the Executive Classes as a result of having been recalled from the Reserve for a period of service or training with H.M. Forces.

2 Sex.

Both men and women are eligible, but women will not rdunarily be appointed to posts in the Admiralty or War Office or to the Immigration Service of the Home Office.

Candidates must either

(a) be serving on 1st August 1955, in an established situation in the General Clerical Class or in the Departmental Clerical Classes of the Customs and Excise Department and the Valuation Office of the Board of Inland Revenue with a certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners: or

(b) be serving on 1st August 1955, on the established (b) be serving on 1st August 1955, on the established conditions of the General Clerical Class or of the Departmental Clerical Classes of the Customs and Excise Department and the Valuation Office of the Board of Inland Revenue except for pension, pending the issue of the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and have been notified by the Commissioners by that date that a decision as to physical eligibility has been deferred; or

(c) if on medical grounds they were not accepted for fully established appointment, be serving on 1st August 1955, on the established conditions of the General Clerical Class or of the Departmental Clerical Classes of the Customs and Excise Department and the Valuation Office of the Board of Inland Revenue except for sick leave and

(d) be serving on 1st August 1955, in clerical posts in the Metropolitan Police Commissioner's Office, the Office of the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District, the Office of the Crown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations, the Forestry Commission or Trinity House, having been appointed to a post in one of those Departments after success in an examination for similar posts held by the Civil Service Commissioners.

Members of the General Clerical Class who have been accepted for transfer to Branch B of the Foreign Service are not eligible.

4. Number of attempts.

No candidate may compete in more than three Limited Competitions for the Executive Classes, excluding any candidature in the Reconstruction Limited Competition.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Comm'ssioners as to their health and character.

6. Examination.

The written examination will consist of papers in English and Arithmetic, a General Paper, and a test of General Intelligence.

Of the candidates who obtain the highest marks in the of the candidates who obtain the highest marks in the written examination a certain number, to be fixed by the Commissioners, will be summoned to an interview at which the Interviewing Board will award each candidate a mark for his or her record and personal qualities. The Department of each candidate summoned to interview will be asked to supply a confidential report and this will be taken into account by the Interviewing Board.

The final order of merit will be determined by combining the marks for written examination and interview.

7. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who dec nes to accept the post offered will have no claim to be get hes to accept the post offered will have no claim to be as gned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but regard will be paid, so far as vacancies permit, to the previous Departmental experience of the candidates and to the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them, and the wishes of candidates will, where poss ble, be taken into account.

An application fee of 15s. is payable by all candidates. This must be ent with the application form and is not reurnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £1 5s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £2, must be paid by each candidate on admission to the examination.
