The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act 1932, Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939. viz:-

The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 9) Order, 1955. Siloxanes, whether polymerised or not, and certain mixtures containing 50 per cent. or more by weight of siloxanes are exempt from duty chargeable under the Import Duties Act, 1932.

This Order extends the exemption to cover all such mixtures, and comes into operation on the 29th September, 1955. It has been published as Statutory Instruments 1955, No. 1473.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 30th September, 1955, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of $\pm 280,000,000$.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, \pounds 25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd October, 1955, to Saturday, the 8th October, 1955, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Baak of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent, (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
