4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. Qualifications.

(i) Candidates must, by the date on which they submit their application forms, have passed in the examination for the General Certificate of Education at the Ordinary level in English Language, Mathematics, and one other subject, preferably Art or Geometrical and Mechanical Drawing or Engineering Drawing or comparable subject;

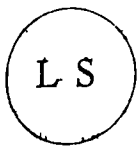
